



# Covid-19 Countermeasures

Peace Boat is currently coordinating with ports of call based on the following guidelines, in order to resume our voyages in December 2021. In order to provide a safe environment for all to enjoy their around-the-world voyage, we will be implementing a comprehensive set of measures from prior to the voyage and until disembarkation.

## Installation of equipment for PCR & Antigen Testing



### Before Departure: Mandatory PCR test

Only those confirmed negative will be permitted to embark.

### During the Cruise: Testing every 10 days

Antigen and PCR tests will be conducted every 7-14 days.

### Body temperature screening

Guests will have their temperature measured at the entrance of the ship by thermographic camera.

\* If a fever is detected, a second check will be conducted with a thermometer.

## Countermeasures in All Ports of Call



### Thorough Preparation for Entry to Ports

As travel restrictions around the world are eased, we are working closely with the port authorities and public health officials to ensure a smooth entry.

### Disembarkation at Ports of Call

Disembarkation in certain ports of call may be limited to those joining optional tours.

\* Local tour guides and drivers will be under medical monitoring for 14 days, and receive a medical consultation & temperature screening prior to the tours.

\* Masks must be worn at all times during tours. Vehicles will be sterilized before and after the tour.

\* Visitors from ports of call are not allowed to embark.

## Enforcing Physical Distancing



The cruise capacity will be limited to 65% to reduce the total number of passengers on board. 10% of guest rooms will be reserved for emergency use.

## Reinforcing Hygienic Measures



Cleaning and sterilizing will take place more frequently and thoroughly, especially for often touched surfaces such as door knobs, hand rails, elevator buttons, etc.

## Restaurants



Opening hours will be extended, and the number of guests permitted at the same time limited. Buffet service will be suspended for the time being.

## Air Conditioning & Ventilation



Cabins and public areas will be supplied with an intake of outside air and vice versa, ensuring a constant exchange and ventilation.

## Installation of Virus Removal Equipment



To further improve the air quality onboard, equipment shown to remove viruses and sterilize bacteria is being introduced.

## PCR & Antigen Tests for All Crew



All crew members are required to monitor their body temperature from 14 days prior to departure. Only those with no symptoms will be allowed to embark.

\* During the voyage, crew members will be required to check their temperature twice a day, frequently wash hands and gargle, sterilize hands, and take regular PCR & antigen tests.
